(Heating, Ventilation, Air Conditioning, and Refrigeration) technology for commercial and industrial applications. Emphasis will be placed on training an individual to have the theory and manipulative skills that will enable that person to be a productive member of the air conditioning and refrigeration industry.

Program Mission and Outcomes

The Refrigeration & Air Conditioning Technology program's mission is to provide technical training to meet the demands of the industry and the needs of the individual to provide employment and prepare students for the EPA exam which is required in the industry.
