For graduation with an Associate in Arts (A.A.) Degree with a major in Human Services:

Minimum Unit Requirements: Any course that appears on a curriculum guide and the General Education Pattern (Plan A) may fulfill both major and general education requirements (Approved by College Curriculum Committee Spring 2012). For this degree, complete a minimum of 60 units in courses numbered 1-599. Please note that additional elective units may be required to meet this minimum based upon courses selected to fulfill General Education for the Associate Degree.

Human Services Major: 25-31 units General Education/A.A. 25 units

- 2. **Scholarship:** Maintain an **overall grade point average (GPA) of 2.0** ("C" average) based on all accredited college work applied to the degree, no matter where completed. For this **field of concentration, complete each course above** with a **grade of "C" or better**, or "P" if course is graded on a P/NP basis.
- 3. **Residence for the Degree:** Complete at least 30 units of the required 60 in residence at LBCC, or complete in residence at LBCC at least 20 units within the last 30 units of work applied to the degree.
- 4. Residence for the Field of Concentration: Complete fifty percent (50%) or more of the unit requirements for this field of concentration in residence; this means at least 12.5 15.5 units of the required 25 31 must be completed at Long Beach City College. Credit earned by exam, where applicable, may be included.
- 5. **General Education and Proficiency Requirements:** Complete the required A.A./A.S. General Education and Proficiency requirements*, otherwise known as "Plan A". For Plan A requirements, refer to the general catalog or view it online at http://osca.lbcc.edu.
- Complete and submit the degree application form to the Admissions and Records office during your final semester of course work. These forms are available in the Admissions and Records office, or online at http://admissions.lbcc.edu/. Refer to the Schedule of Classes (http://schedule.lbcc.edu) and click the "Important Dates" link to view the actual deadline for each semester.

*The requirements for general education/proficiency and the field of concentration (major) need to be from the same catalog year. This catalog year may be any year between the years of initial enrollment to the present, provided continuous enrollment is maintained throughout. See the catalog for definition of "continuous enrollment". Unless otherwise noted, "double-counting" is not allowed. That is, one course may not be used to fulfill both a field of concentration requirement and to fulfill a general education requirement.

For graduation with a **Human Services Certificate of Achievement:**

- 1. Complete each of the **REQUIRED COURSES** listed above with a **minimum grade of "C"**, or better, or "P" if course is graded on a P/NP basis.
- 2. Complete fifty percent (50%) or more of the unit requirements for this field of concentration in residence; this means at least 12.5-15.5 units of the required 25-31 must be completed at Long Beach City College. Credit earned by exam, where applicable, may be included.
- Complete and submit the certificate application form to the Admissions and Records office during your final semester of

Career Opportunities

Students learn the skills and knowledge necessary to transfer to upper division programs in social work or human services and to be employed at the paraprofessional entry level in social work and human services agencies.

This Certificate of Achievement will prepare students for an entry-level position in the human services/social work field.

This **Associate Degree** will prepare students for an entry-level position in the human services/social work field and for career advancement for those already employed in these occupations.

Program Mission and Outcomes

The mission of this program is to prepare students for careers in the helping professions, prepare students for the first two years of their transferrable Human Services education and enhance the skills of persons already employed in this field. In addition, students are provided with several personal/interpersonal skills needed to live healthy lives and deal with the stressful demands of daily living.

Outcomes:

- Develop a psychosocial treatment plan for a client.
- Analyze information and assess level of crisis intervention needed to best meet client needs.
