\*\*Double-Counting of Units: STAR Act Regulations allow for double-counting of major requirements towards CSU- GE Breadth or IGETC patterns, and **6 units** of the Administration of Justice for Transfer coursework can be applied to the CSU- GE Breadth or IGETC patterns.

- 2. Minimum grade and GPA requirements: Maintain an overall grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 ("C" average) in all CSU-transferable coursework. For the major complete each course with a grade of "C" or better, or "P" if course is graded on a P/NP basis.
- 3. Residence for the Degree: Complete at least 12 units of the required 60 in residence at LBCC.
- 4. Degree Application: Complete and submit the degree application form to the Admissions and Records office during your final semester of course work.
