For graduation with a Human Services Certificate of Achievement:

- Complete each of the REQUIRED COURSES listed above with a minimum grade of "C", or better, or "P" if course is 1. graded on a P/NP basis.
- Complete fifty percent (50%) or more of the unit requirements for this field of concentration in residence; this means at 2. least 12 units of the required 24 must be completed at Long Beach City College. Credit earned by exam, where applicable, may be included.
- 3. Complete and submit the certificate application form to the Admissions and Records office during your final semester of course work. Career Opportunities

Students learn the skills and knowledge necessary to transfer to upper division programs in social work or human services and to be employed at the paraprofessional entry level in social work and human services agencies.

This Certificate of Achievement will prepare students for an entry-level position in the human services/social work field.

This Associate Degree will prepare students for an entry-level position in the human services/social work field and for career advancement for those already employed in these occupations.

Program Mission and Outcomes

The mission of this program is to prepare studens for careers in the helping professions, prepare students for the first two years of their transferrable Human Services education and enhance the skills of persons already employed in this field. In addition, students are provided with several personal/interpersonal skills needed to live healthy lives and deal with the stressful demands of daily living.

Outcomes:

- Develop a psychosocial treatment plan for a client.
- Analyze information and assess level of crisis intervention needed to best meet client needs.
