****Double-Counting of Units:** SB 1440 Regulations allow for double-counting of major requirements towards CSU- GE Breadth or IGETC patterns, and **6-9 units** of the Elementary Teacher Education for Transfer coursework can be applied to the CSU- GE Breadth or IGETC patterns.

- 2. Minimum grade and GPA requirements: Maintain an overall grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 ("C" average) in all CSU-transferable coursework. For the major complete each course with a grade of "C" or better, or "P" if course is graded on a P/NP basis.
- 3. **Residence for the Degree:** Complete at least 12 units of the required 60 in residence at LBCC.
- 4. Degree Application: Complete and submit the degree application form to the Admissions and Records office during your final semester of course work. These forms are available in the Admissions and Records office, or online at <u>http://admissions.lbcc.edu/</u>. Refer to the Schedule of Classes (<u>http://schedule.lbcc.edu</u>) and click the "Important Dates" link to view the actual deadline for each semester.

Program Mission and Outcomes

The Reading and Teacher Preparation Department's mission is to provide high-quality, authentic, and contextualized learning experiences for students. Our reading courses will develop critical readers of text who use the thinking processes required to successfully meet literacy tasks across all disciplines. Knowing the text-based challenges awaiting students in college and the workplace, our courses provide a rigorous and research-based curriculum. In addition, our teacher preparation program will develop students who demonstrate professional knowledge and interdisciplinary subject-matter expertise. Teacher candidates will be prepared to utilize evidence-based practices, including equitable and inclusive teaching practices to serve in diverse communities, and to develop a strong sense of agency to serve as advocates for students.

Program Outcomes:

- 70% or more of students with declared education majors who have completed 30 or more units of the AA-T in Elementary Teacher Education Pathway are able to earn the AA-T within six years.
- Students will evaluate their level of introductory preparation for careers in teaching and related subject knowledge on a self-assessment survey.
