#### Associate Degree requirements continued from the previous page:

For graduation with an Associate in Arts (A.A.) Degree with a major in Radio/Television Producer:

 Minimum Unit Requirements: <u>§Any course that appears on a curriculum guide and the General Education Pattern</u> (Plan A) may fulfill both major and general education requirements (Approved by College Curriculum Committee <u>Spring 2012</u>). For this degree, complete a minimum of 60 units in courses numbered 1-599. Please note that additional elective units may be required to meet this minimum based upon courses selected to fulfill General Education for the Associate Degree.

Radio/Television Producer Major:34 unitsGeneral Education/A.A. §25 units

- Scholarship: Maintain an overall grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 ("C" average) based on all accredited college work applied to the degree, no matter where completed. For this field of concentration, complete each course above with a grade of "C" or better, or "P" if course is graded on a P/NP basis.
- 3. Residence for the Degree: Complete at least 12 semester units of the required 60 semester units in residence at Long Beach City College in order for the college to grant an Associate of Arts and/or an Associate of Science Degree.
- 4. Residence for the Field of Concentration: Complete fifty percent (50%) or more of the unit requirements for this field of concentration in residence; this means at least 17 units of the required 34 must be completed at Long Beach City College. Credit earned by exam, where applicable, may be included.
- 5. **General Education and Proficiency Requirements:** Complete the required A.A./A.S. General Education and Proficiency requirements\*, otherwise known as "Plan A". For Plan A requirements, refer to the general catalog or view it online at <a href="http://osca.lbcc.edu">http://osca.lbcc.edu</a>.
- Complete and submit the degree application form to the Admissions and Records office during your final semester of course work. These forms are available in the Admissions and Records office, or online at <u>http://admissions.lbcc.edu/</u>. Refer to the Schedule of Classes (<u>http://schedule.lbcc.edu</u>) and click the "Important Dates" link to view the actual deadline for each semester.

\*The requirements for general education/proficiency and the field of concentration (major) need to be from the same catalog year. This catalog year may be any year between the year of initial enrollment to the present, provided continuous enrollment is maintained throughout. See the catalog for definition of "continuous enrollment".

#### **Career Opportunities**

Students prepare for producing radio or television programs either independently or in a production environment.

This **Certificate of Achievement** will prepare students for an entry-level position or provide skills for advancement in a variety of venues including radio, television, film, and related digital or computer technology (multimedia) in the communication, information, and/or entertainment industries.

The **Associate Degree** will prepare students for career advancement in this field. Appropriate course selection will also facilitate transfer to a four-year college or university in broadcast, film, computer animation, or multimedia production.

#### **Program Mission and Outcomes**

This program's mission is to provide an academic (AA degree), a certificate, and the personal preparation for successful transfer to a university. The Digital Media Arts, or Broadcast Television & Radio program and to provide vocational training and skills to successfully gain an internship or employment in the Radio/Television and media entertainment industry as a producer of media content. As well as to provide a General Education course necessary to fulfill transfer requirements, and to provide meaningful and vital opportunities and outreach to the community at large to engage in the creation of radio-television and multi-media productions.

- Demonstrate collaboration skills related to personnel and time lines for an industry ready radio or television segment.
- Critically assess the responsibilities of various creative and technical staff positions and evaluate the importance of each to the production.
