- 3. **Residence for the Degree:** Complete at least 12 semester units of the required 60 semester units in residence at Long Beach City College in order for the college to grant an Associate of Arts and/or an Associate of Science Degree.
- Residence for the Field of Concentration: Complete fifty percent (50%) or more of the unit requirements for this field of concentration in residence; this means at least 15 units of the required 68 must be completed at Long Beach City College. Credit earned by exam, where applicable, may be included.

Advanced Transportation Technology (A.S. and Certificate of Achievement):

- Students will analyze and demonstrate their technical knowledge and practical skills to properly and accurately diagnose and repair advanced propulsion systems used in electric, hybrid, and Compressed Natural Gas vehicles.
- Develop the skills to assess and deduce vehicle drive ability concerns pertaining to advanced transportation technologies.

Alternative Fuel Vehicles and Electric & Hybrid Vehicle (Certificate of Achievement):

- Define the pros and cons of various types of propulsion systems of alternative fueled vehicles.
- Formulate diagnostic strategies for resolving vehicle concerns.

Automotive Quick Service (Certificate of Accomplishment):

• Evaluate and prepare vehicles for quick service according to the manufacturer procedures.
