For graduation with a **Photojournalism Certificate of Achievement:**

- Complete each of the REQUIRED COURSES listed above with a minimum grade of "C", or better, or "P" if course is graded on a P/NP basis and a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0.
- Complete fifty percent (50%) or more of the unit requirements for this field of concentration in residence; this means at least 16-17 units of the required 32-34 units must be completed at Long Beach City College. Credit earned by exam, where applicable, may be included.
- Complete and submit the certificate application form to the Admissions and Records office during your final semester of course work. These forms are available in the Admissions and Records office, or online at http://admissions.lbcc.edu/ . Refer to the Schedule of Classes (http://schedule.lbcc.edu) and click the "Important Dates" link to view the actual deadline for each semester.

Career Opportunities

This field of concentration, with an emphasis in Newspapers/Magazines or social media, provides a basic program for students interested in careers requiring journalistic training, such as newspaper or internet reporting, magazine or free-lance writing.

The emphasis in **Public Relations** provides a basic program for students interested in careers in any aspect of public relations and in writing and editing in-house or websites or social-media platforms.

The **Publication Specialist** emphasis provides a basic program for students interested in learning to produce a variety of publications including newsletters, brochures, websites, proposals, social-media platforms and house magazines.

The **Certificate of Achievement** provides access to entry-level employment in a variety of journalism related fields. These include newspapers, magazines, web sites, newsletters, social-mediaplatforms and press relation offices.

The **Photojournalism Certificate of Achievement** provides students with the ability to learn the entry-level skills necessary to embark upon a career in the news online and documentary photography field. It includes emphasis in practical applications leading to career advancement.

Program Mission and Outcomes

The journalism program prepares students with a body of knowledge and a system of inquiry, scholarship and training for careers in which they are accountable to the public interest for their knowledge, ethics, competence and service; to members of society, clients or consumers for their competencies and the quality of their work; and to employers for their performance.

Outcomes:

- Gather and prepare material accurately and fairly while meeting deadlines.
- Apply teamwork skills to publish a newspaper, magazine, or website.
