This letter is formal notification of the action taken by the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN) at its meeting on July 10-11, 2014. The Board of Commissioners granted continuing accreditation to the associate nursing program and scheduled the next evaluation visit for Spring 2022.

- Ensure records reflect that program complaints and grievances receive due process and are maintained in accordance with the ACEN guidelines.
