## General Education Certification Requirements

Either completion of the California State University General Education-Breadth pattern (CSU GE Breadth) OR the Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) pattern IS REQUIRED. After completion of the General Education Pattern **students must request GE certification**. Consult with a counselor for more information about the GE Certification process.

## Other Degree Requirements

1. **Minimum Unit Requirements:** Complete a minimum of 60 transferable units, distributed as follows:

**\*\*Double-Counting of Units:** SB 1440 Regulations allow for double-counting of major requirements towards CSU- GE Breadth or IGETC patterns.

2. **Minimum grade and GPA requirements:** Maintain an **overall grade point average (GPA) of 2.0** ("C" average) in all CSU-transferable coursework. For the major **complete each course with a grade of "C" or better**, or "P" if course is graded on a P/NP basis.
3. **Residence for the Degree:** Complete at least 12 units of the required 60 in residence at LBCC.
4. **Degree Application:** Complete and submit the degree application form to the Admissions and Records office during your final semester of course work. These forms are available in the Admissions and Records office, or online at <http://admissions.lbcc.edu/> . Refer to the Schedule of Classes (<http://schedule.lbcc.edu>) and click the "Important Dates" link to view the actual deadline for each semester.
5. The requirements for general education/proficiency and the field of concentration (major) need to be from the same catalog year. This catalog year may be any year between the year of initial enrollment to the present, provided continuous enrollment is maintained throughout. See the catalog for definition of "continuous enrollment".

## Program Mission and Outcomes

The Administration of Justice program at Long Beach City College is a comprehensive offering of courses created and designed for the purpose of educating and training diverse groups of students who aspire for careers in the Criminal Justice System. The program provides both certificates of completion and degrees that reflect our students' levels of educational preparedness for entry-level opportunities in Law Enforcement, Corrections, and the Courts. Students are expected to successfully develop college level skills and knowledge in furtherance of transferring to four-year institutions and successful careers in Criminal Justice.

- Explore the history development, structure and functions of the American criminal justice system.
