
# Jacaranda Essay Contest



The English Department and the LBCC Foundation are pleased to announce the Annual Jacaranda Essay Contest to acknowledge students for outstanding work written in composition and literature classes during the Fall, Spring, and Summer semesters.

## **CONTEST RULES**

- 1. Entrants must be enrolled in an LBCC English course, and the essay must be written for a class in the LBCC English Department. Each entrant may submit only one essay per category, per semester.
- 3. All entries must be submitted with an entry form signed by the entrants' instructors (additional forms are available at www.lbcc.edu/English/Jacaranda.cfm). In addition to the hard copy, an electronic copy must also be submitted.
- 4. While writing the essay, entrants may seek the assistance they would normally receive from their instructors or the Writing and Reading Success Center.

- 5. Essays must be the original work of the entrants.
- 6. Because winning essays will be published, the subject matter must not infringe upon the rights of any third party.
- 7. For Spring, Summer, and Fall entries, the deadline for submission is the last day business day of February.

### PRIZES AND RECOGNITION

- 1. Prize-winning essays will be selected for the following qualities:
  - -Originality and Insight
  - -Strength of Purpose
  - -Convincing Development
  - -Clarity and Precision of Language
  - -Effective Arrangement of Parts
- 2. It is expected that essays will be generally correct in grammar, mechanics, and documentation.
- 3. Cash prizes are awarded in each category. An entrant may not win more than one prize per category.
- 4. Honorable Mention awards are given to additional essays of merit and also include prizes.
- 5. Winning essays will be made available to faculty and students through the publication of Jacaranda during the Spring semester.
- 6. Winning entrants will be notified by mail.

#### ESSAY FORMAT and SUBMISSION

- 1. The entrants' names should *not* appear on the essays. Include essay's title and page number in the upper-right-hand corner of each page. Do not staple; fasten with a paper clip.
- 2. Essays are not to bear instructor's remarks.
- 3. When needed, entrants must document all sources using MLA style and must include a Works Cited page.
