SCREENING & DISCUSSION

No Más Bebés is a documentary of the story of immigrant mothers who sued county doctors, the state, and the U.S. government after they were pushed into sterilizations while giving birth at the Los Angeles County-USC Medical Center during the 1960s and 70s. Led by an intrepid, 26-year-old Chicana lawyer and armed with hospital records secretly gathered by a whistle-blowing young doctor, the mothers faced public exposure and stood up to powerful institutions in the name of justice.

Dr. Virginia Espino is the Co-Producer of the *No Más Bebés* documentary, a historian and lecturer in Chicana/o Studies and Labor Studies at UCLA and an Executive Board Member of the California Latinas for Reproductive Justice. She earned her PhD from Arizona State University writing about population control politics and reproductive injustice during the 1970s. Following the documentary screening, there will be an engaging question and answer session with Dr. Espino herself.
